IQAC of Lakhimpur Girls' College was constituted on 18th January 2005. After its reconstitution IQAC is monitoring the Best Practices Promotion and Quality Promotion in the college. After the Ist NAAC Peer Team Visit, the IQAC worked for meeting up the areas of concern indicated by the Peer Team. 
