Introduction:

Myths and legends have always found place in the various folktales narrated by our forefathers, which have thereby passed to the future generations through the oral medium. The oral mode of storytelling, in fact, has been one of the most important ways in which folklores and legends spread both in spatial and temporal dimensions, which has been stated quite correctly by R.P. Lama as "...folklores of all communities are usually handled eventually by the oral tradition in a debased or distorted form' (163).
