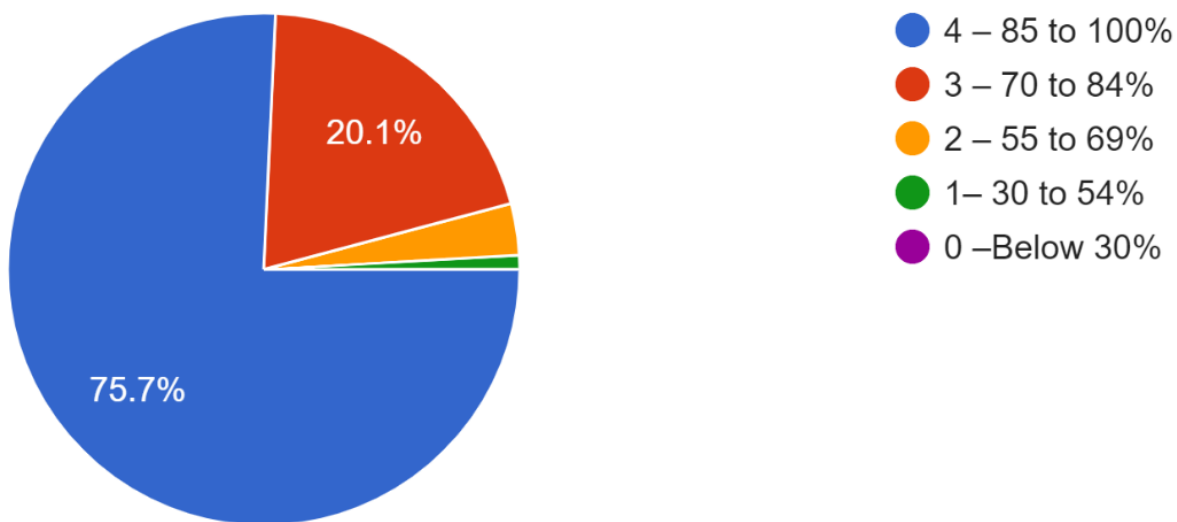
- All questions should be compulsorily attempted.

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

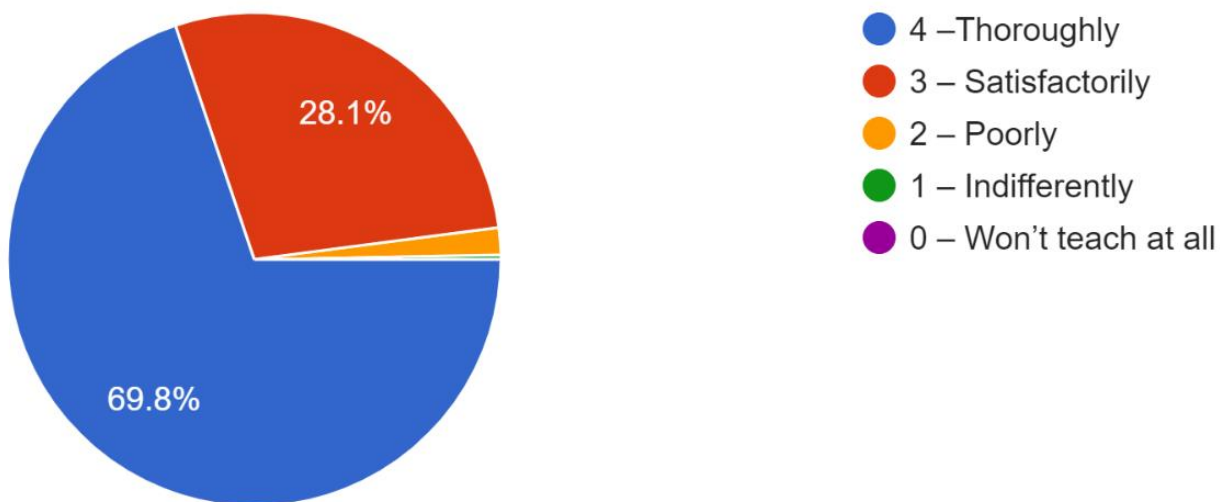

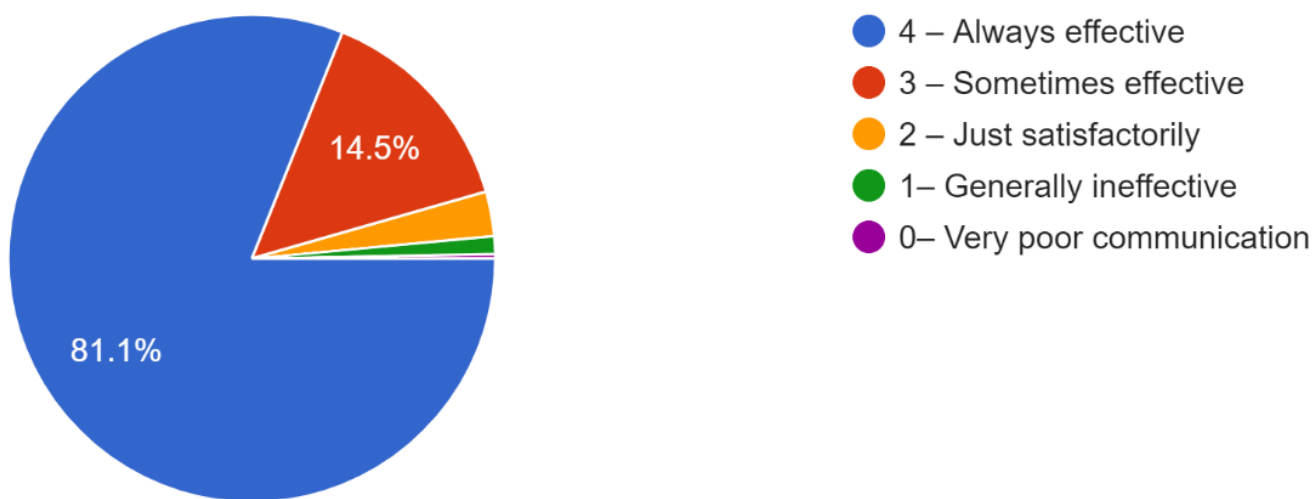

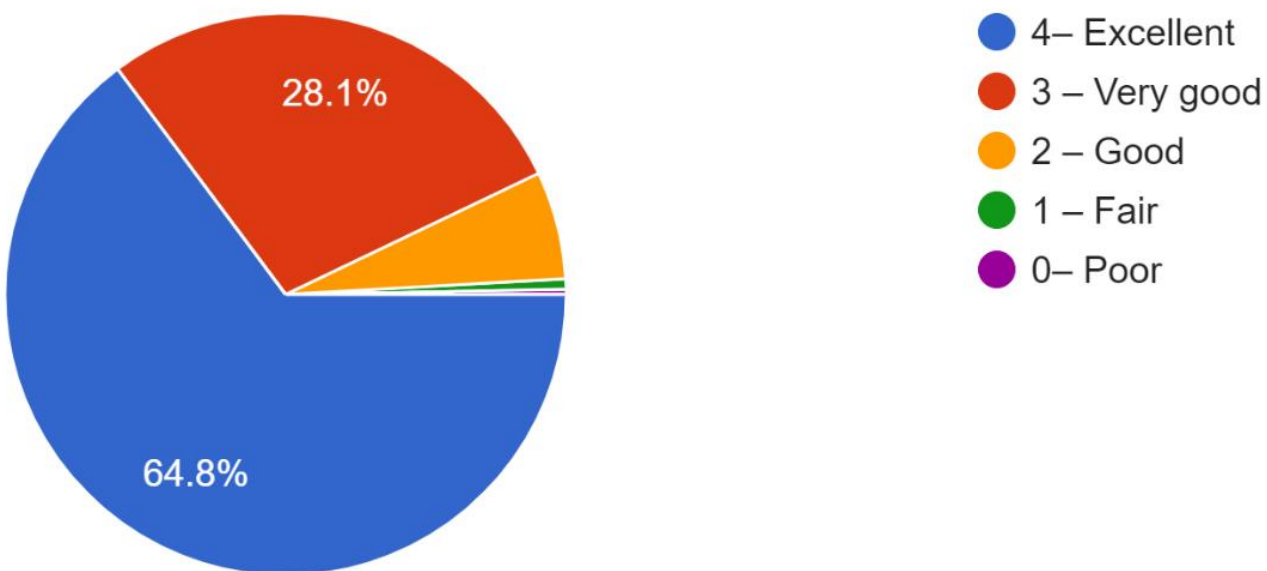

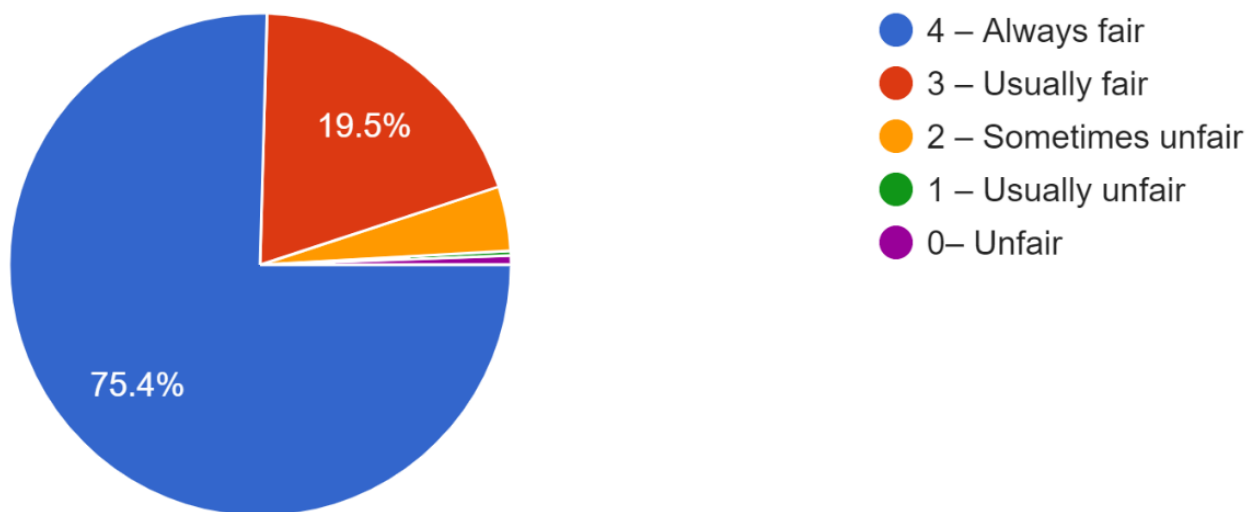

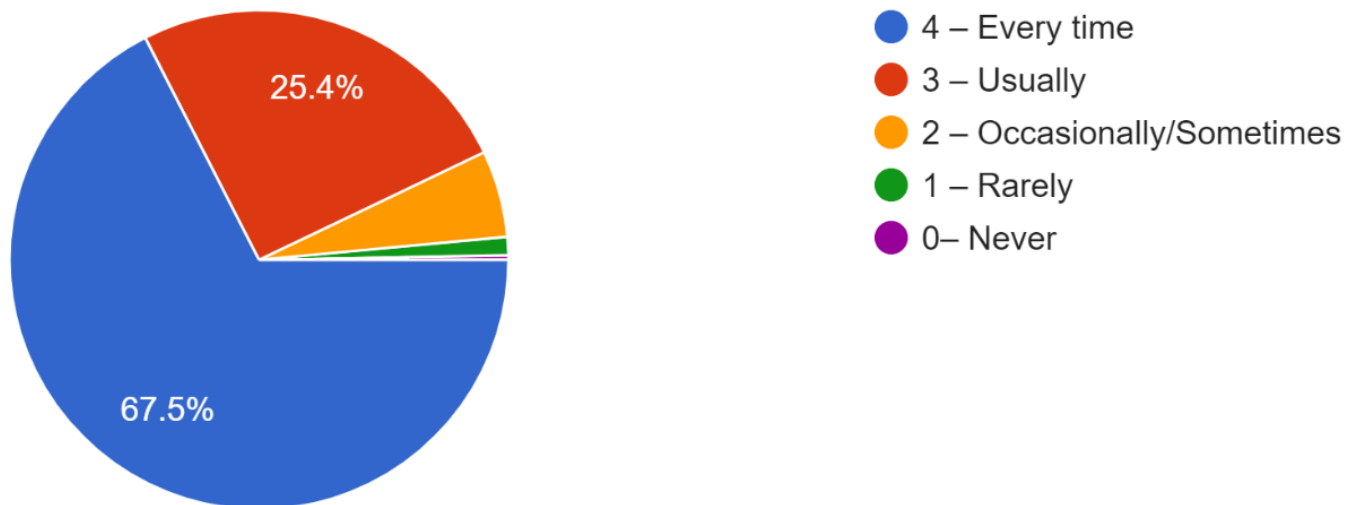

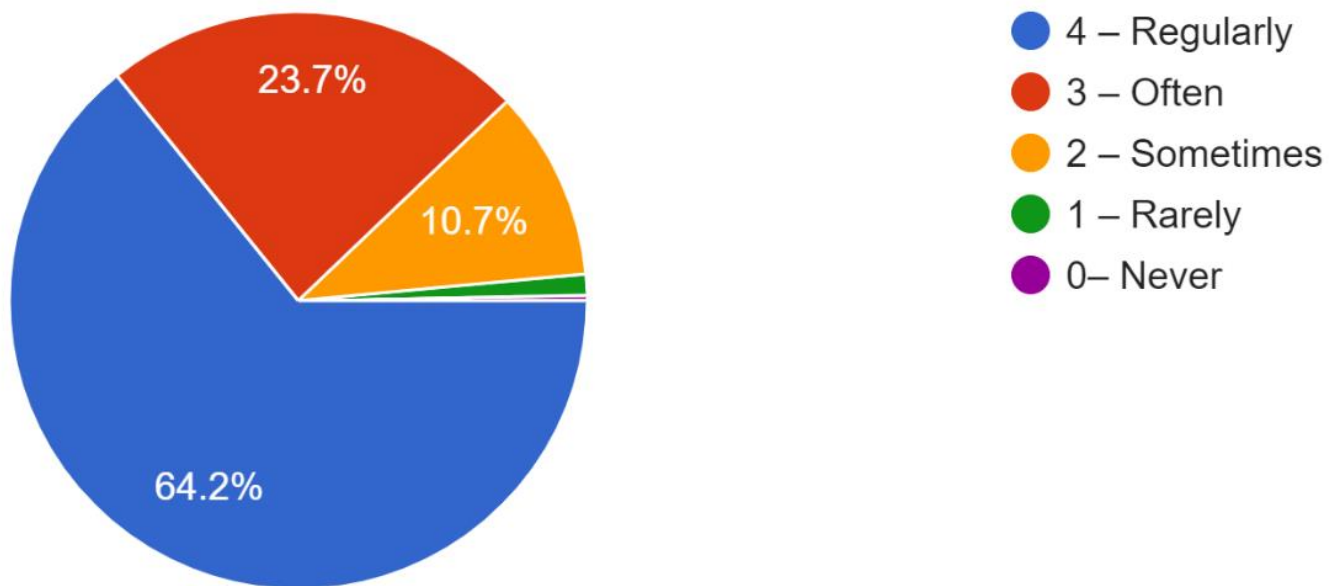

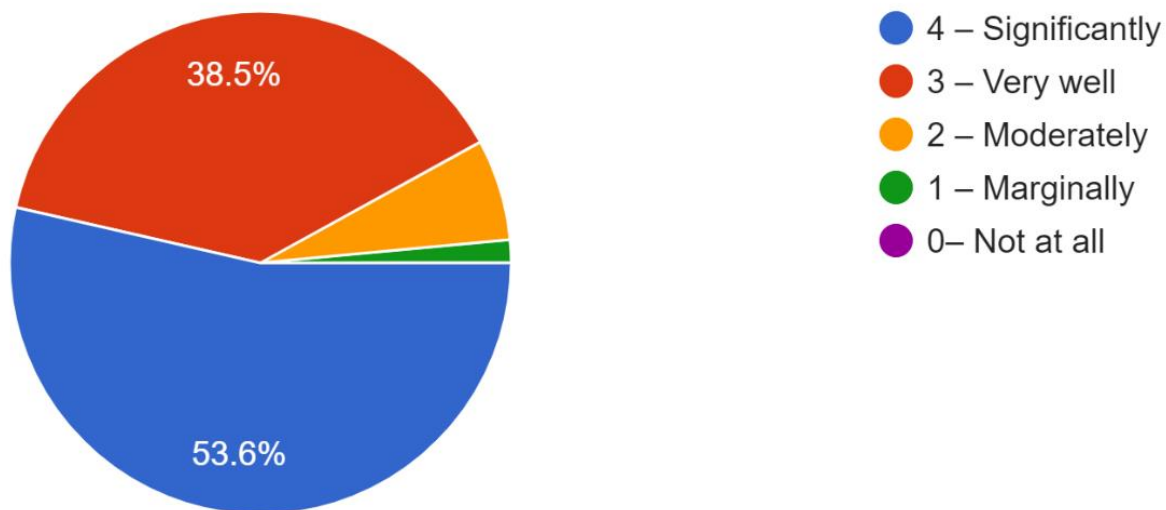

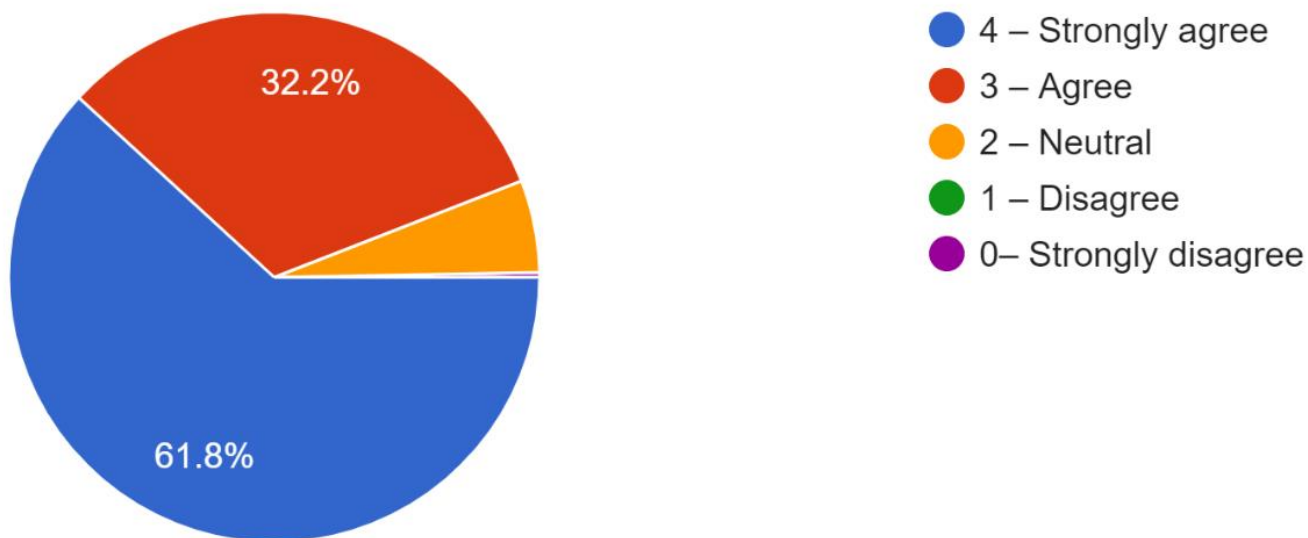

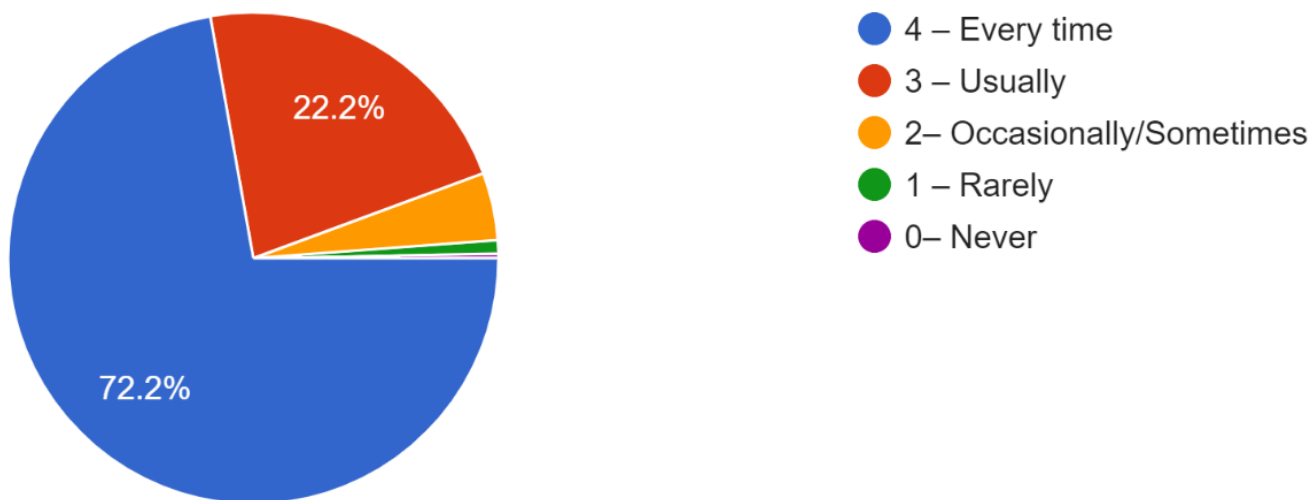

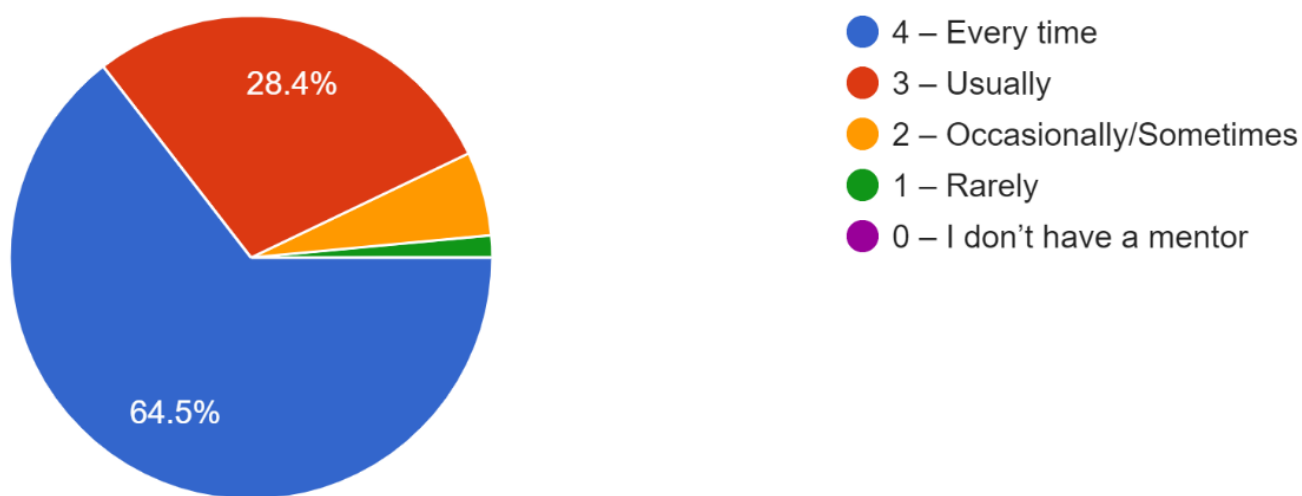

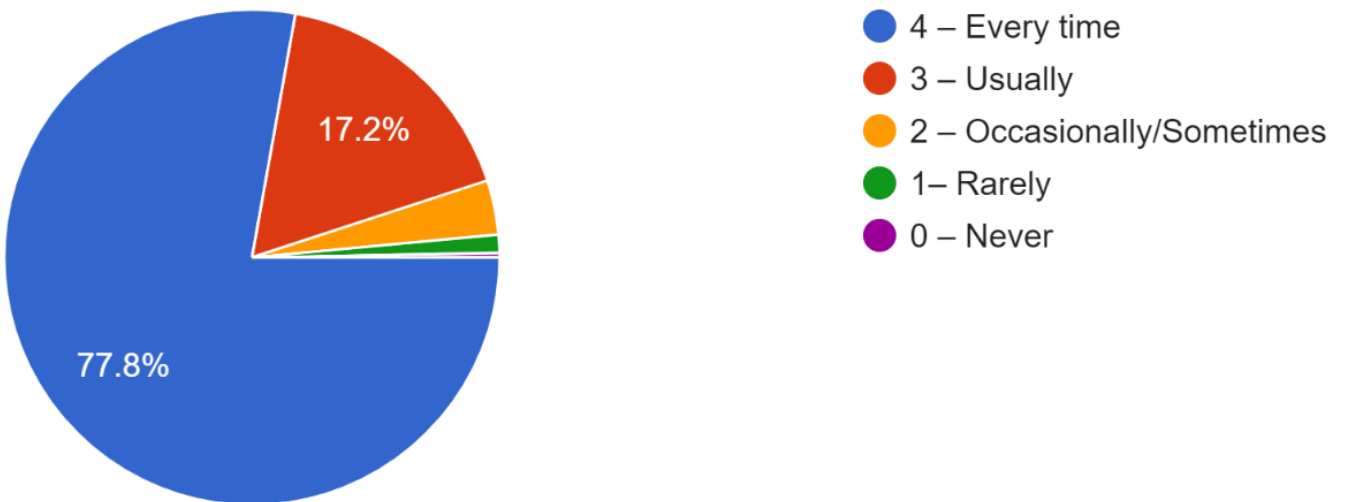

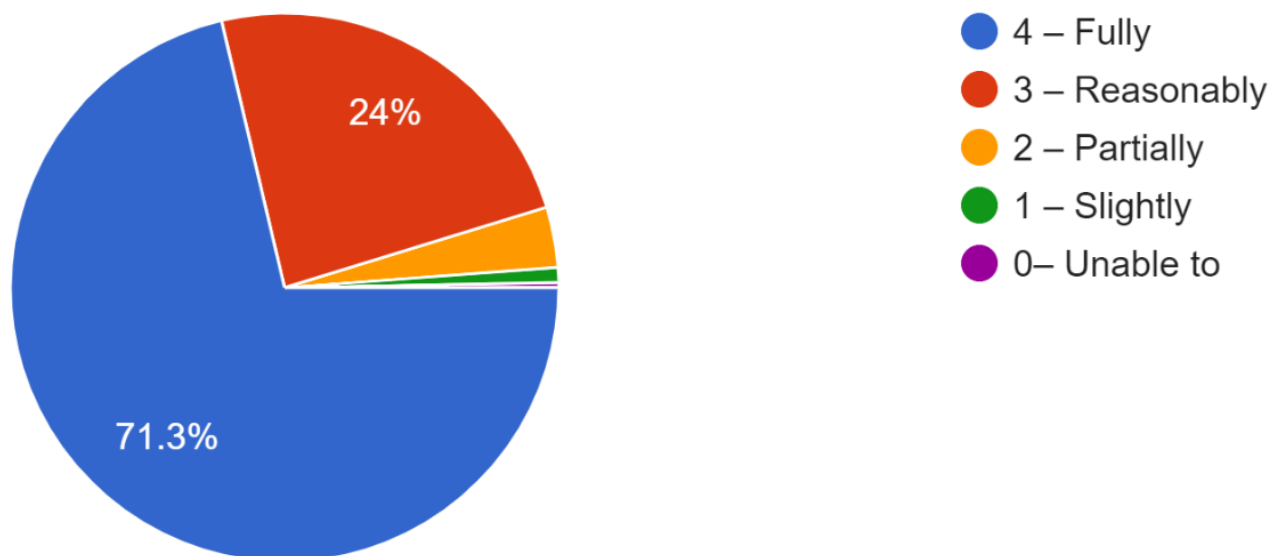

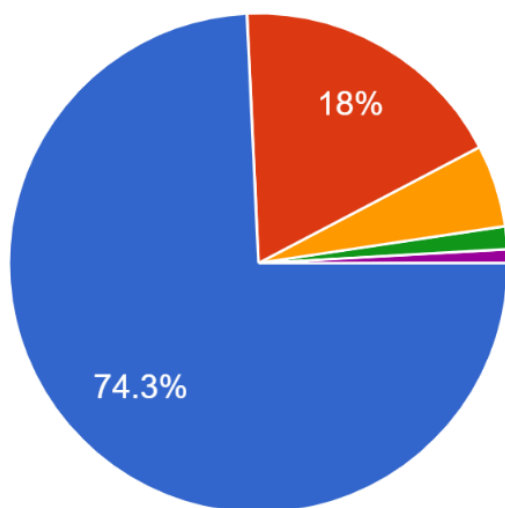

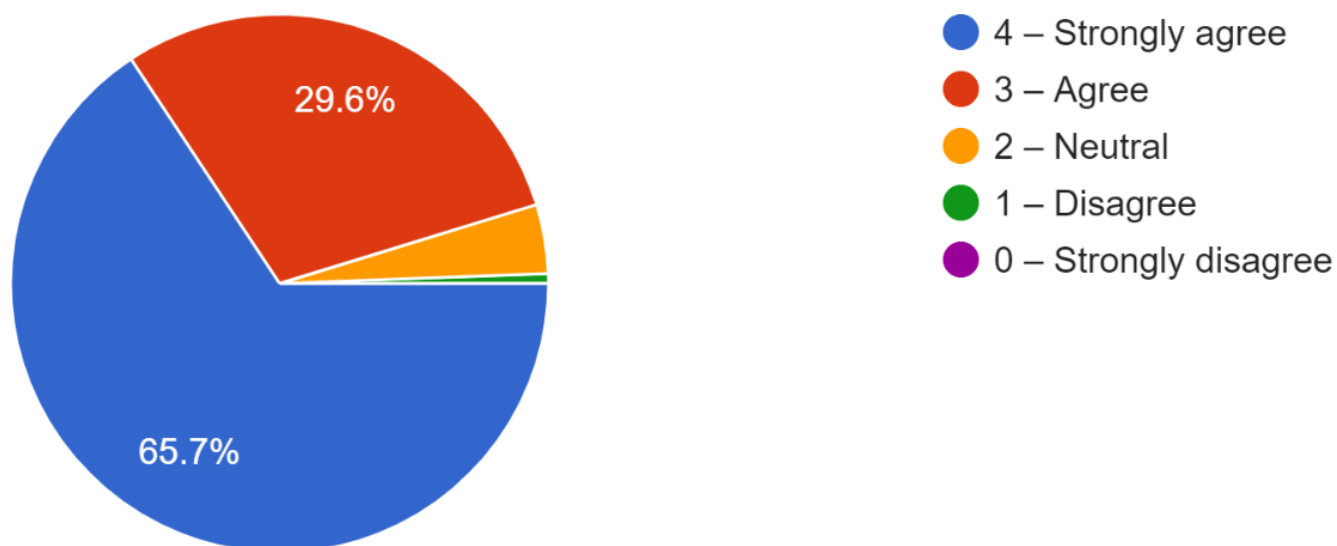

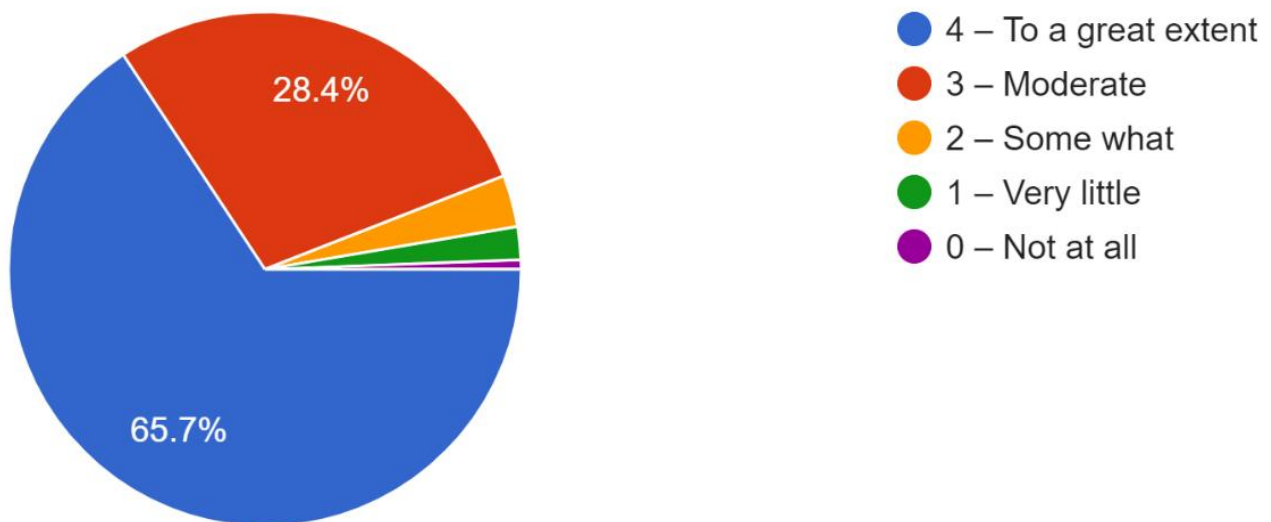

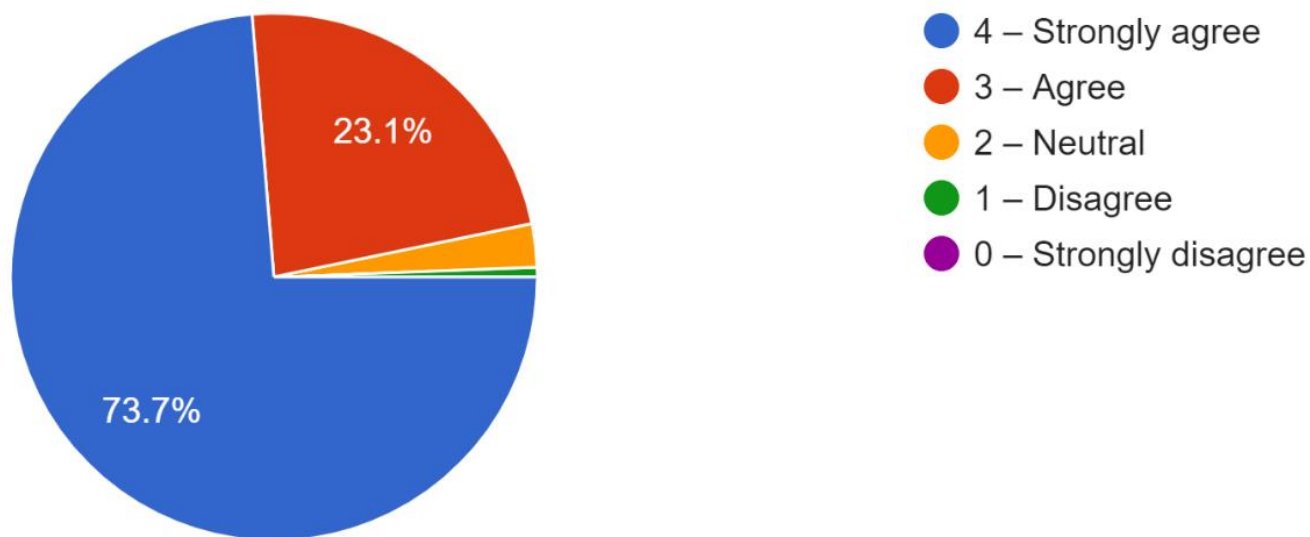

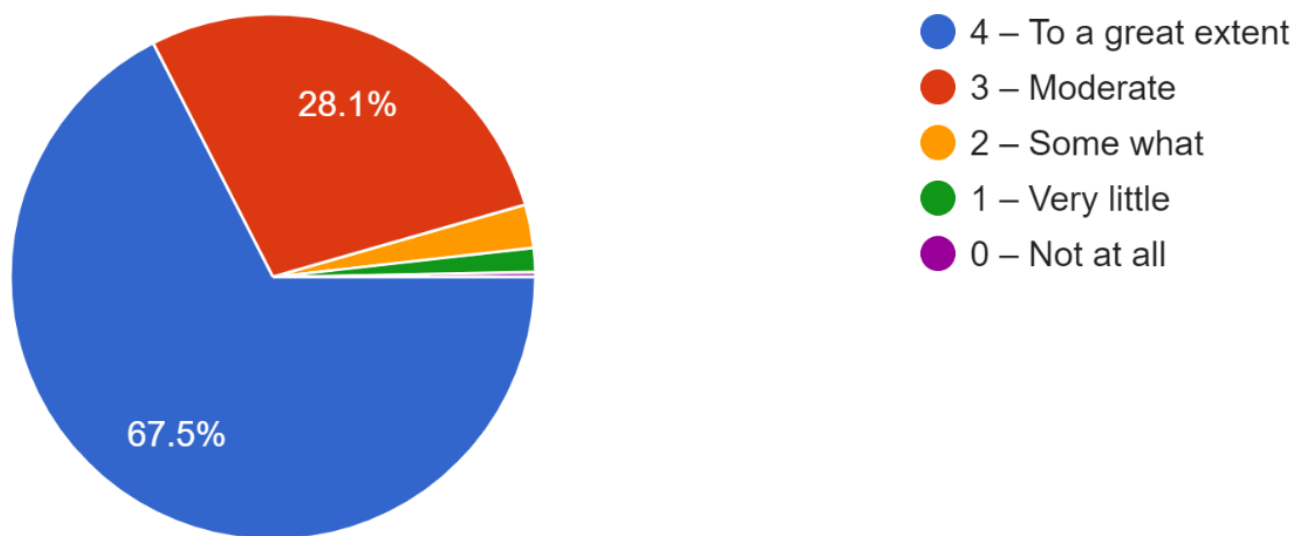

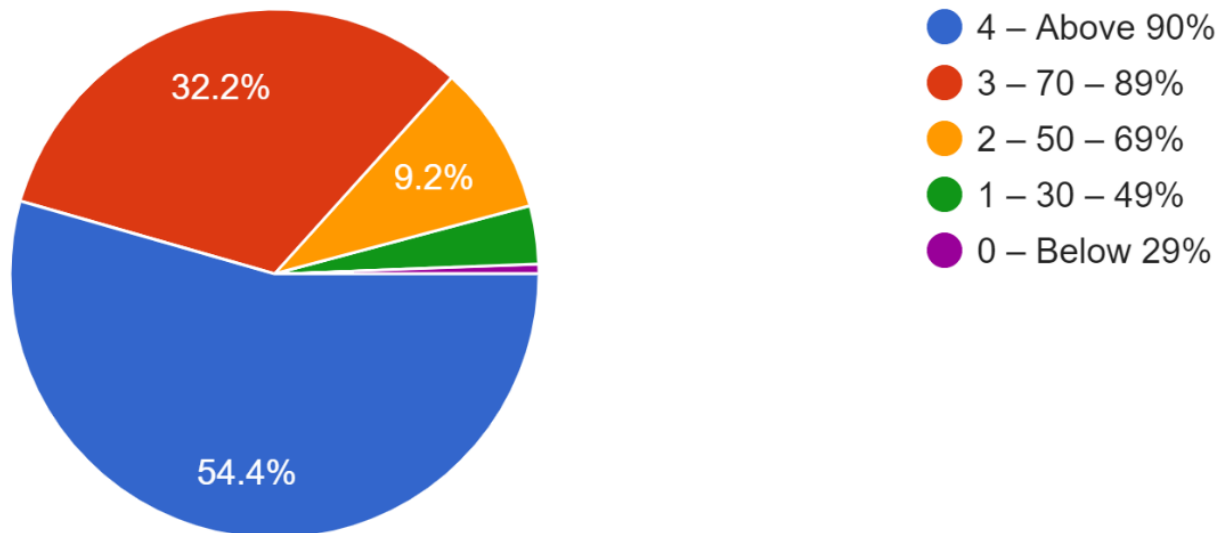

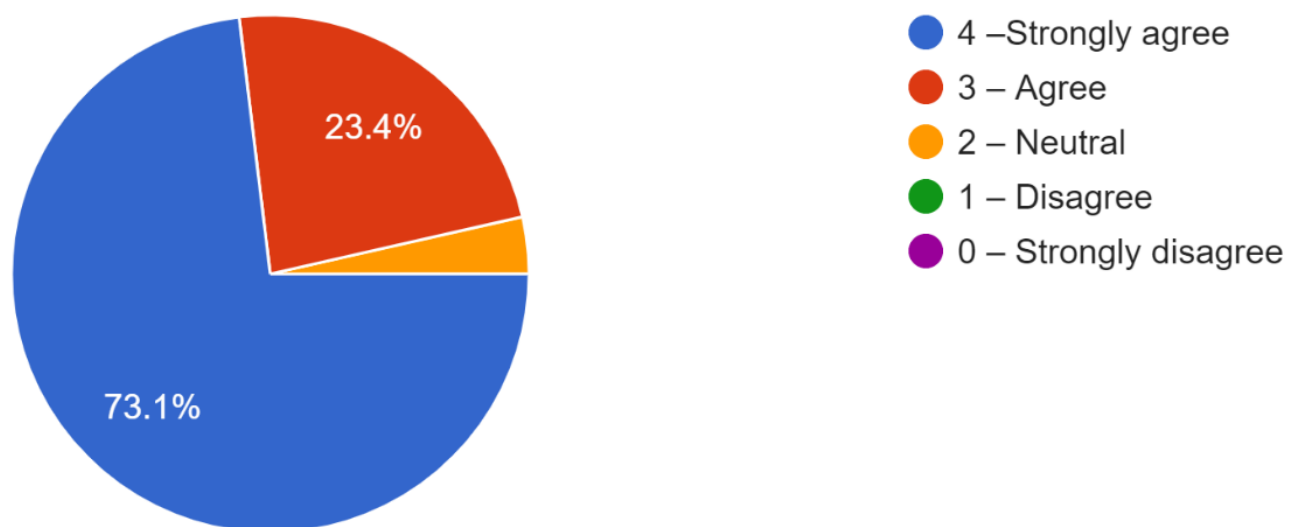
