



1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 244 responses




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?




3. How well were the teachers able to communicate? 244 responses







4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 244 responses



5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 244 responses




6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 244 responses
















