About the College

Lakhimpur Girls’ College (Autonomous), established on 16 August 1972, is a leading institution for women’s higher education in the north bank of the Brahmaputra in Upper Assam. Founded through the initiative of educators and the local community of North Lakhimpur, the college was renamed in 1975 to reflect its broader mission.

The college has maintained strong academic standards and has been recognized under Sections 2(f) and 12(A). It received permanent affiliation from Dibrugarh University in 2007 and was provincialised by the Government of

Assam in 2005. It also offers distance education programmes under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University and promotes career-oriented and research activities.

Set on a green campus, the college provides modern facilities including a well-equipped library, laboratories, hostel, health and fitness centres, conference hall, and internet-enabled academic spaces. Postgraduate studies in Home Science have been offered since 2015, making it a unique centre in the region.

Accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, the college earned a 'B+' grade (2004), 'A' grade (2014), and 'B++' grade (2023). It also has an active Internal Quality Assurance Cell.

The institution has a strong record in academics, sports, NCC, and cultural activities. Marking a new milestone, the college was granted **autonomous status on 4 August 2025**, and from the **2026–27 academic session, it will function as an autonomous institution**. With its commitment to excellence, it continues to grow as a prominent centre of higher education.

Eligibility for the UG Programmes

Applicants must have passed the Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) examination, or an equivalent qualification corresponding to Level-4 (National Higher Education Qualification Framework).

Admission to Undergraduate programmes will be strictly on a merit basis, in accordance with the reservation policy of the Government of Assam. The Major subject will be allotted in the first semester. Students may apply to change their Major in the third semester, after completion of the first year, subject to the availability of seats in the respective department

Eligibility and admission procedure for ITEP

Admission to ITEP with Secondary Stage Specialization shall follow the NCTE guidelines. It will be done through a suitable subject and aptitude test (National Common Entrance Test (NCET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) and shall be standardised, keeping in view the linguistic and cultural diversity of the country. Its score would reflect the relative performance level of the candidate for merit-based selection to secure admission.



Course Structure:

The Course Structure of the FYUGP and ITEP Programme shall be as per the Course Structure given in Annexure I. The nature of the Courses for all Under Graduate Academic programmes shall be as below:

Sl. No	Category of the course	Description
1	Major Discipline	<i>Major discipline provides the opportunity for a student to pursue in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline. Major discipline is the discipline or subject of Main Focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses of the major discipline.</i>
2	Minor discipline	<i>Students who take a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than the chosen major will qualify for a minor in that discipline. Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline.</i>
3	Multi-Disciplinary Generic Elective	<i>All UG students are required to undergo 3 introductory level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experiences and form part of liberal arts and science education. However, students shall not be allowed to choose or repeat any of these courses already undergone at the Higher Secondary level (12th class) and the discipline which she has chosen as Major. Introductory courses on Natural Sciences to be chosen from a basket of courses that would include, for example, Astronomy and Astrophysics, Biology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Computer Science, Data Science, Earth and Atmospheric Sciences, Physics, Statistics, etc. Each Department/Centre of Studies shall offer GEC.</i>
4	Ability Enhancement Courses	<i>Language (MIL/Regional Language)</i> <i>These courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. Students are required to achieve competency in the use of a MIL or Regional Language. All language disciplines except English shall offer Language Courses</i>

		<p><i>Language and Communication Skills (English)</i></p> <p><i>Students are required to achieve competency in the use of English language with special emphasis on language and Communication Skills. Department of English shall offer this course.</i></p>
5	Value Added Course	<p><i>The courses aim to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate certain values. These courses include Health and Wellness, Yoga, Environmental Studies, Understanding India, Digital fluency, etc.</i></p> <p><i>Environmental Studies course is a compulsory add-on course; students are required to pass this course, but the credits earned will not be counted towards their SGPA/ CGPA.</i></p>
6	Skill Enhancement courses:	<p><i>These courses aim to impart practical skills, hands on training, soft skills etc. to enhance the employability of the students. The institution may design courses as per the students' needs and available institutional resources subject</i></p>
7	Community engagement (NSS/Adult Education/Student mentoring/NGO/ Govt. institutions, etc.)	<p><i>The curricular component of 'community engagement and service' seeks to expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learning can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems. This component will include participation in activities related to National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), adult education/literacy initiatives and mentoring school students and other community works.</i></p>
8	Field based learning/project	<p><i>The field-based learning/project will attempt to provide opportunities for students to understand the different socio-economic contexts. It will aim at giving students exposure to development-related issues in rural and urban settings. It will provide opportunities for students to observe situation in rural and urban contexts, and to observe and study actual field situations regarding issues related to socio-economic development. Students will be given opportunities</i></p>

		<p>to gain a first-hand understanding of the policies, regulations, organizational structures, processes, and programmes that guide the development process.</p>
9	Internship	<p>Students will be provided with opportunities for internships with local industry, businesses, artists, crafts persons, etc. so that they may actively engage with the practical side of their learning and, as a by-product, further improve their employability.</p>
10	Research / Dissertation	<p>All students pursuing a Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours with Research will be required to take up research oriented advanced courses, research methodology courses and a Dissertation before the completion of the Programme.</p> <p>NB: Students intending to pursue Honours with Research shall have to enroll in the beginning of the 7th semester. Departments concerned shall allot Supervisors to such students on the basis of their area of interest. For students pursuing Honours with Research, 50% of the In-semester marks will be allocated for preparation of synopsis / Project of the proposed Dissertation to be submitted in the 8th semester.</p>

ABOUT THE POST GRADUATE COURSE IN COMMUNITY SCIENCE

Community Science is the science of a home and community. It includes all the things that concern the person, home, family members, resources and society. It is the education for “better living” and the core of this education is the “family ecosystem”. Its scope is not limited only to household activities of women; it provides diverse exposure to the learners and practitioners. Home science prepares the students with great variety of vocation and career fields and also enables them to get self-employed.

Lakhimpur Girls' College has introduced P.G. course in Community Science from the academic session 2015-2016 under Dibrugarh University for the first time in North East India at college level.

Course Details

- **Total No of Seat:** 15 (Fifteen)
- **Mode:** Self Financing
- **Fees Structure:** Rs. 25,000.00 per Semester
- **Duration:** 2 years (Four Semester)
- **Eligibility:** BA/BSc with Major in Home Science
- **Selection Procedure:** On the basis of merit / Admission test

Procedure for Admission

General information

- The admission procedure of the college is online.
- Applications for admission to the college will be available at the Samarth Portal. For more details on application process, kindly visit <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>.

- Admission to the college and hostel is strictly on a merit basis and subject to approval of the Principal.
- The date of the interview for admission to various classes is notified in advance.
- A list of the eligible candidates for admission is put up on the college notice board before the day of interview.
- Interview and admission take place on the same day and same time.
- The candidate will have to present personally in the interview with the necessary documents.

Reservation for Admission

- The college follows the Government Reservation rules.
- There is reservation for SC, ST and OBC/MOBC students.
- There is also Tea-garden employee quota, Sports and Music quota for admission into various classes.
- Students with outstanding quality may apply to the Principal directly on a plain sheet with all supporting documents and certificates.

N.B.

- Students who are admitted on sports quota are required to attend practice regularly, failing which their admission will be cancelled.
- Wards of tea garden employees are to produce necessary documents.

Documents to be submitted

A candidate must produce the following documents in original at the time of admission:

- Mark Sheet and pass certificate of the last qualifying examination.
- Photocopy of original certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- Certificate of Date of Birth.

- Caste certificate from competent authority (wherever applicable).
- Certificate/Documents for co-curricular activities (if any).
- Gap period Certificate from an appropriate person if any (for a maximum of one year only).

Free admission

Free admission for students from economically weaker sections is provided as per rules set by government of Assam. For free admission, documents stating annual income must be submitted.

Selection of candidates

Selection of candidates will purely be on merit basis.

Facilities in College

Hostel Facility

The College has two Girls' Hostels (both UG & PG) within the campus, accommodating around **200 students**. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission strictly based on merit.

- The boarders must maintain a decent, dignified and disciplined hostel lifestyle inside and outside the hostel.
- They must abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Hostel as may be prescribed to them by the College Authority, violation of which will lead to strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion of the guilty inmate from the hostel leading to consequent expulsion from the college.
- Boarders must enter the hostel within the time as may be fixed by the Superintendent for summer and winter seasons and must be present at their respective seats at the time of roll call.
- Boarders are required to fill up the required details and to sign on a register every time they leave the hostel premises (except during college hours) and to sign again on return. Strict measures are to be

taken against any boarder found violating.

- Guest/Visitors are not allowed to enter any room allotted to the resident except with permission from the authority.*
- Visitors, other than local guardians, are not allowed to meet the boarders except on such days, time and duration as may be fixed by the Principal.*
- All the boarders must abide by the mess-rules prescribed by the Mess Committee. They have to pay their Mess-dues as may be fixed from month to month by the Mess Committee within the tenth day of every month.*
- Boarders are required to keep their rooms neat and clean and observe proper methods of garbage disposal. Use of electric equipment such as iron, heater etc. not permitted.*
- Boarders are required to maintain silence during study hours. Any kind of disturbance during study hours is treated as a serious offence.*
- No boarders should stay away from hostel on any day without the prior permission of the Superintendent/Principal.*

Library and Reading Room

The College has a digital library which is efficiently maintained with a computerized data-filling system. It consists of a good number of books and journals to serve the needs of both students and faculties. The College also has reading rooms separately arranged for both students and teachers.

Digital Class Room

The college has a well-furnished digital class room with all modern IT based teaching aids. The digital video projector also enables screening of cinemas required in various disciplines.

Computer Laboratories

The College has two computer laboratories with around 35 computers. It provides facilities for the students to carry out various innovative and scientific experiments.

Students' Aid Fund

The college provides special scholarship to a few selected meritorious students from poor economic background. On application to the Principal with necessary documents, an amount upto a maximum of Rs. 3000/- (lumpsum) is granted.

Students' Travel Concession

Students are entitled to travel concession by rail on production of identity card on their way home from the institution and back during vacation only.

College Canteen

The College has a hygienic and well-maintained canteen. It provides food at a subsidized rate to the students and members of the College community. There is a 'Canteen Committee' for the overall maintenance and checking of food rates and quality.

Sports Facilities

The College strives for an all-round development of the students. To build a sports-friendly campus, the College provides facilities for both indoor and outdoor games.

Language Lab

The College has a well-equipped language laboratory for students of the English Department to conduct various activities in order to enhance their linguistic knowledge. The lab possesses adequate computer facilities.

Mathematics Lab

The College has a well-equipped Mathematics laboratory to assist the students in their studies. The lab is provided with original MATLAB software and an internet connection to help the students to explore various Mathematical concepts.

Girls' Common Room

To facilitate the students, the College has a well-maintained Girls' common room. The Girls' common room provides a proper place for the students to relax, study and also it is the perfect place for recreation of the students.

Gunjan Karan Memorial Conference Hall

The College inaugurated a new Gunjan Karan Memorial conference hall on **13th May, 2023**. The hall has well-equipped ICT facilities to facilitate a favourable environment for various lectures, meetings and conferences or seminars.



Gymnasium

With the minimum necessary equipment, the college also provides a gymnasium for the students to carry on various activities for physical health including yoga classes.

Yoga Centre

The College has a Yoga Centre for the students and faculty members of the College to improve their mental and physical health. The centre organizes various workshops on Yoga and observes International Day of Yoga every year.

The Govt. of Assam is introducing Skill Hub at Lakhimpur Girls' College, offering an exciting range of specialized skills and training programmes starting this academic year. Code of Conduct for Students

1. Students must never disrupt the college environment and must always maintain a proper conduct both inside and outside the college premise.

2. Since the college is an anti-ragging campus, such activities are strictly prohibited.

3. In regards to the rules and regulations decreed by the authorities, any students found to go against the set rules will be punished depending on the degree of offence.

4. Students must always maintain a respectful behaviour towards the Principal, Vice Principal, teachers, librarian, office staffs and other members of the college in general.

5. Students who opt to bring their mobile phones inside the campus must remember that except the canteen and the common room, they are not allowed to use their mobile phones anywhere. They might use

*their phones inside the classroom only when permitted by the teacher. Students residing in hostels are also not allowed to use their phones from **6:30 pm to 7:00 am**.*

*6. Class attendance of students must not be less than **75%**.*

7. All leave applications must be submitted to the HoD and the concerned teachers on time. In case of medical leave, applications must be furnished with valid medical certificates.

8. The students must always enter the campus in proper uniform. They are also expected to attend all the college functions in their college uniform unless specified otherwise.

9. Students must be careful while using social media. They must never misuse the platform.

10. Students with two-wheelers must always use a helmet, along with relevant documents like driving license and vehicle fitness certificates.

11. No students are allowed to enter or leave the classroom when a session is in progress, unless permitted by the concerned teacher.

12. It is the prime duty of the students to keep the campus clean. Littering inside and around the college campus is an offence. If found, the students will be punished accordingly.

13. Consumption of intoxicants and hallucinogens, chewing of tobacco etc. are strictly forbidden.

14. Any form of political activity, like unauthorized meetings, imposition of propaganda etc. is completely banned inside and outside the college.

15. The Disciplinary Action Committee is empowered to deal with cases related to the violation of discipline by the students.

16. Care and respect for common facilities and utilities are an essential component of Social Responsibility. In view of this, any wilful damage to college property will be considered an offence.

College Uniform

Either:

1. A round neck plain white kurta (knee length) with a college emblem and half-inch green border on the sleeves.
2. A white Patiala pyjama.
3. Bandhani print parrot green dupatta. Dupatta should be worn in a V-shape.
4. Off-white sweater (when needed).

Or:

1. A white mekhela and white chadar with green border.
2. A white blouse.
3. Off-white sweater (when needed).

Identity Card

- The college authority issues an identity card to every student at the time of admission.
- This card is not transferable.
- It contains vital information about the holder, viz. name, semester, class-roll no. and a passport size photograph duly attested and signed by the Principal.
- Every student is expected to carry the identity card with her at all times.

Attendance

- Class attendance of students must not be less than **75%**.

Respect for Property

Care and respect for common facilities and utilities are an essential component of social responsibility. In view of this any wilful damage to college property will be considered an offence.

Anti Ragging

Lakhimpur Girls' College is a ragging free campus and maintains a **Zero Tolerance Policy on Ragging** and other activities which are declared as

*punishable offence. It strictly follows the **UGC Regulation on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009** as per the directions of the honourable Supreme Court of India. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel her from the college.*

General Rules for Maintenance of Discipline in College

- *The societies and associations shall be subject to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.*
- *Only such societies or associations as have been recognised by the Principal shall have opportunity to use the facilities of the college premises.*
- *All notices desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the college and hostel premises shall require the approval of the Principal.*
- *Principal's signature over the identity cards shall be affixed within 15 days from the date of admission and bringing identity cards to college is compulsory for all students.*
- *Filled up registration forms should be submitted in the office within the stipulated time as fixed by college office. No registration form will be received after such time.*
- *Monthly college fee may be paid to the college on all week days except on Saturday from **10:30 AM to 1 PM**. During payment the previous receipt is to be produced.*
- *For the pass certificate one has to apply one day ahead and for the transfer certificate application must be made at least two days ahead.*
- *Class attendance of a student should not be less than **75%**.*
- *The following activities of the students in the college will be treated as serious offence. All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and the disciplinary action committee and their decision shall be final in all such matters.*

Serious Offences

- *Encouraging and participating in ragging of any type.*

- *Forcible disruption of classes.*
- *Destruction of college properties like furniture, walls, fencing etc.*
- *Misbehaviour shown towards fellow friends, teachers and employees of the college.*
- *Forwarding any type of wrong information to the college authority.*

Students' Diary

The students are provided with a diary which has to be carried to college every day. The diary will be verified by teachers or any other authority at any moment.

Other Related Information

Career-Counselling Cell

*The College launched a **career-counselling cell** for the benefit of the students in **2004** with the objective to provide life skills to the students and to make them efficient in the competitive job market. The cell also provides updated information to the students regarding careers. The counselling cell remains open for the students daily and is well-equipped with computers, internet facilities and sufficient reading materials like competitive examination books, textbooks, newspapers etc. for providing information regarding various career opportunities.*
